<u>CELEBRATING 75 YEARS OF METHODIST</u> <u>HOMES FOR THE AGED</u>

In the years before the current Welfare State or the NHS were set up, the Rev Walter Hall recognised the need even then to support older people. His vision was supported by the Methodist Church with funding for the first home, The Ryelands in Wallington, Surrey, and a values-led, innovative organisation was born.

In July 1943 – the Methodist Conference agreed to proposals from a committee set up the previous year to

'Consider the advisability and practicability of establishing Methodist homes for people usually of sixty years of age or over, who desire to avail themselves of such amenities as the homes provide, and agree to contribute to their means.'

Fast forward to 2018 and MHA now runs 90 care homes, 72 retirement living schemes and 61 Live at Home schemes, supporting more than 17,800 older people across England, Scotland and Wales, employing 7,000 staff and enjoying the support of over 5,500 volunteers.

75 years on from the agreement of the Methodist Conference to the setting up of MHA and the charity is continuing and improving on the care it was initially set up for.

MHA's new chief executive, Sam Monaghan, comments:- "As I walked round MHA's care home and retirement living settings – I was struck by the quality of care, the environment, but more so the interaction of staff with residents, their families and each other. There was a genuine respect, warmth and valuing of all concerned. There was evidence of strong links with the local community; the benefits of the chaplaincy and music therapy services. That sense of hope, enabling people to live to their full potential. And it's an exciting time as MHA marks its 75th anniversary in 2018, after members of the Methodist Church had the vision to provide homes for older people.

The Rev Walter Hall was a true visionary in seeing

what was needed to support older people all those years ago. That vision means we are now part of many communities across England, Scotland and Wales, providing support and care to thousands of older people each day.

Some other landmarks:-

1977 - Methodist Homes Housing Association was set up and MHA's first retirement living scheme opened at Church Court in Midsummer Norton, Somerset.

1988 – Lichfield Live at Home scheme opens to support older people living in their own homes and to help tackle loneliness and isolation.

1997 – MHA's first purpose designed home for people living with dementia opens at Mayfields, Ellesmere Port.

2008 – Pioneering music therapy is introduced for, and free to, residents living with dementia in MHA's specialist dementia care homes. Today MHA are the UK's largest employer of music therapists.

As MHA celebrate their 75th anniversary, Methodist Homes Sunday will have a special focus on the achievements of age and the completeness of life, writes the Rev Dr Chris Swift.

'Full of years' is the phrase from the Book of Genesis describing Abraham and the richness of his extraordinary role in history. As the pace of change in Western society has accelerated, the idea that older people are witnesses to multiple worlds has grown. Those in later life bridge not simply generations but vastly different contexts of experience. This length of years gives them a unique perspective on the passage of time and a society where lasting change has taken place in every community.

Those 'full of years' can offer a sense of perspective to younger people who feel disturbed by the pace and content of change. I hope that as we prepare for Methodist Homes Sunday we'll take time to listen to those in the care of MHA, and learn to focus on the things that matter in each and every age."
