


Colchester Methodist Circuit

Dear Friends,

NEWS FROM: the Circuit

FAREWELL and welcome services for Rev Joe Adams and Rev Hannah Chun will take place at Wimpole Road on 16th July and 1st September respectively. Timings and further details will be circulated in due course.

MONTHLY walks have been enjoyed by a number of people around the circuit. Derek C reports here on the April and May walks:

Hillhouse Wood (April) - It was a little muddy in places underfoot and there was a cool breeze moving the occasional cloud across the sky but this did not deter Kathy, Clive, Carol, Chrissie, Janet B, Jenny, Janet S, Geoff, Jan, Ian, Sylvia, Andrew and Derek from enjoying a walk amongst the bluebells. Although they needed a few warm days to be at their very best, the bluebells were far enough out in flower to provide a colourful cover to the woodland floor. The party walked together for the first mile of open countryside and those who elected to do 3 miles then entered the wood whilst those wishing to walk the 5 miles followed a series of footpaths before then entering the wood. Thanks are due to Sylvia and Andrew who were the guides to the shorter walk and to Kathy who made a kind offer to provide a cup of tea at the end of the afternoon.

Stour Valley Walk from Wormingford (May) - This was a walk in two parts. On the Tuesday prior to the planned day of the walk, 9th May, Carol, Clive and Derek walked the planned route just to make sure all the paths were accessible and on 9th May, Jan, Geoff and Derek did the walk. Others said afterwards, if the weather forecast hadn't mentioned the likelihood of rain and lightning, they would have come too! In the event and in sunshine, the Stour Valley Path was followed from Wormingford Church as it dropped steeply on the flood plain of the Stour. At the picturesque Bures Mill, the river was crossed and field paths were used on the Suffolk bank to reach Smallbridge Hall after which it was back into Essex and uphill to return to the church.

More walks are planned and all are welcome to join. The next will be in the Colne Valley on Tuesday, 20th June, starting beneath the viaduct at Chappel (adjacent to the Wakes Colne Chappel Corner bus stop and close to the village shop). This walk will follow the Essex Way and the course of the River Colne as it flows towards Colchester. The walk will commence at 2.15pm after the arrival of the No. 88 bus which leaves Osborne Street at 1.40pm and can be boarded at several stops in Lexden Road and then Halstead Road at about 1.50pm. For anyone requiring a walk of approximately 3 miles, it will be possible to take the bus back into Colchester from Ford Street (the No. 88 calls there at 10 and 40 minutes past each hour). The full walk of approximately 6 miles will end in Stanway via Cook's Mill and Iron Latch.

Designated parking in this area is available if required. Please contact a fellow walker or our Circuit Administrator on 07797 077736 or via colchestermethodist.office@gmail.com for further details.

Walks of approximately 3 and 5 miles are planned for 11th July at Boxted; a 5 mile walk at Nayland on 8th August; and a 3 mile walk at Shrub End on 22nd August.

From Lexden

From Castle

AT our annual Church Meeting in March, a presentation was given on the results of the Circuit SPA day. Much discussion was had, especially once we had broken into small groups and a range of posters were produced. A small working group has been formed to further the work, which we will discuss at our next Church Council having consulted the whole Church family. Feedback has started to come in and we look forward to moving on in a positive way.

IN the run up to Easter, we were able to share in the events of Holy Week, with in person worship and fellowship for the first time in some years. Following our Soup and Snack lunch on Maundy Thursday, Rev Chris led us through a very meaningful service of Holy Communion. This prepared us for our service of readings, hymns and meditation on Good Friday. We were joined by our friends from St. Botolph's Church, who took an active part in our worship. Again, prepared and led by Rev Chris and undertaken without announcement, we were led through the events of that day in a very meaningful and thought provoking way. One of our refugee friends took the part of Simon by carrying the wooden cross to the front of the church. After the service we enjoyed coffee and hot cross buns with our friends and visitors. We celebrated the joy of our Risen Christ with Holy Communion on Easter day. During the service each member of the congregation was able to come forward and place a flower on our Easter Cross, which we placed in the big window overlooking the Castle Park at the close of the service. Once again it was a joy to welcome many visitors and friends.

A LOCAL group has started using Castle twice a week as a base for teaching English as a second language to migrants and refugees from many countries. The classes have gone from strength to strength, with demand being very high. We are pleased we can host this very important work in our community.

THE Bridgeway sewing and dressmaking group want to thank everyone who has donated fabric to them. It has been greatly appreciated by the refugee ladies in the group. However, material is still in short supply and if anyone has unwanted fabric, suitable for making garments for the ladies and their children, please contact Jan C and we can arrange collection.

WE have copies of Hymns & Psalms which we no longer need and would be happy to give them to any church which might use them. Please contact Chris P if you are interested and he will arrange delivery.

From The Well

AS we said in the last Newsletter, we envisaged our Warm Space (weekly) - now "Warm Welcome" - and Community Food Pantry (fortnightly) to continue into the foreseeable future on our premises. This has been the case but the opening times are now from 12 noon to 4 pm.

AT the March Circuit Meeting we reported the good news of ecumenical co-operation and community involvement that we enjoy at The Well. This was well illustrated when we had a Myland Churches Together presence at the 'Coronation Picnic in the Park' organised by Myland Community Council, on a local playing field. Between the churches we offered craft activities, balloon modelling, baby-care tent, nail painting, temporary tattoos, coronation cakes – all for free! We also had a Prayer Tree and it was good to share in conversations with those who live in our community.

RECENTLY we were blessed in the unexpected news that a lady from Boxted left a substantial legacy in her will to the Methodist Church there, which is now part of The Well. The Trustees for Methodist Church Purposes have informed us that the money now rests with The Well and we will be considering prayerfully how best to use this wonderful gift.

FOLLOWING the Circuit 'SPA' Day, we started our Mission Planning at a meeting on Sunday 14th May led by Rev Chris. We had a time of free thinking as to what might be our hopes and dreams for the future. Chris will collate this ready for our next meeting.

From Wivenhoe

CHURCH life in Wivenhoe continues on its normal cycle of worship, service and witness. The focus of this is centred around Sunday worship at 11am, Knit and Natter and Ladies Fellowship on Thursday afternoons and our monthly Saturday Coffee Morning.

HOWEVER, on Good Friday we joined with the other four Wivenhoe Churches for our annual walk of witness and reflective worship, organised by 'Churches Together in Wivenhoe'. About two dozen of us walked and prayed along the length of Wivenhoe carrying a cross. We then assembled with others at the Methodist Church for worship led by our own Rev Joe Adams. The Church was full.

ON Whitsunday at 12 noon members and friends from all Churches will meet in the Annexe at St Mary's to celebrate the Church's birthday with coffee and cake.

BEING an elderly congregation means that the loss of members is inevitable and three of our members have died recently and a number of other people have various health problems, including two of our local preachers. Please remember them in your prayers. Pastoral care is a very high priority at Wivenhoe with frequent home visits and phone calls taking place. Weekly newsletters are either emailed out or hand delivered to all.

OUR monthly coffee mornings in aid of the 'Beacon of Hope' charity being run by our own Dr Bagamba and his wife in and around Bunia, Democratic Republic of Congo are always well attended by people from all churches and none.

LADIES Fellowship has a varied programme. They have recently had talks from the Blood Runners and Wivenhoe Foodbank and been entertained by Wivenhoe Hoolies shanty choir.

KNIT and Natter also continues monthly on a Thursday. Blankets and other items were sent to Zambia some time ago and pictures and videos of their distribution have been received.

WE are sorry that Rev Joe Adams is leaving us shortly and wish him and Dave every blessing in their new home. We look forward to Hannah's arrival and pray that she and the family will quickly and happily settle into life and work in the Colchester circuit.

From West Mersea

OUR Warm Spaces venture continues on Wednesdays from 11am until 1.30pm at the request of our guests. It has now become a Community Lunch, where mums bring their babies/preschool children to meet up with other adults in our community. We have the opportunity, together with members of our congregation for lunch and a chat. It has been such a joy to see the interaction between the ages and to meet up with people we might otherwise never have come into contact with.
