

God bless, Chris **COLCHESTER** Methodists' new minister, probationer Rev Hannah Chun, has arrived in the city with her family and will be formally welcomed to the Circuit at a service at Wimpole Road on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> September.

The new Connexional year sees welcome changes in the Circuit. As well as Hannah's appointment, Alistair has started a new role as Circuit Finance Officer, which will give our current Circuit treasurer the chance to finally retire from his role.

Alistair's is a paid-for position in a joint venture with the Tendring Methodist Circuit who were also in need of a treasurer. By joining forces with Tendring for a finance officer to take responsibility for the separate day to day bookkeeping and budgeting for each circuit it was possible to secure the appointment of Alistair, who is a chartered accountant and a practising Christian. Alistair focusses his financial services and accountancy expertise on faith groups.

**ALL** the Methodist Churches in Colchester will be represented under one (canvas) roof at a free Family Fun Day in the city's lower Castle Park on 23<sup>rd</sup> September. Family games and activities will be on offer at the Circuit-run tent, giving an opportunity to meet new folk and show them what Colchester Methodists are all about. Volunteers are urgently needed to contact the organisers, Rev Paul and Keith to offer their support and help on this important day in the city's social calendar.

**THE** Circuit is now able to offer face to face training for those who have yet to complete online courses on Equality, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) and an Introduction to Unconscious Bias, both of which are required training for members who have roles in leadership and worship in our churches.

Circuit steward Sally has already guided a group through EDI training at Wimpole Road, and a three-hour training session is now ready to be led by Sally and her fellow Circuit steward Judith, and local preachers' secretary Ron, on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> September at The Ark. Further information will be distributed to all churches in the coming days and weeks.

The second part of required training, an introduction to Unconscious Bias, will be led by Rev Paul in a two-hour session on 7<sup>th</sup> October at Wimpole Road.

Online training is still available to those who need to complete it and cannot attend the face-to-face sessions. Sally (Wimpole Road) and Judith (The Ark) are the people to contact for further details.

**GIFTS** from around the Circuit to the Easter Offering Appeal earlier this year totalled £1,161.55. Thanks to all those who contributed. Viv commented that although the Easter Offering Service is written at least a year in advance it again seemed very relevant to the current world situation and the needs that are calling out to be met.

AS a result of our Mission Planning, we have recently started a fortnightly Prayer Time on a Tuesday morning before our Warm Welcome/Community Pantry sessions.
