

# Letter from our Superintendent, Rev Chris Preece

#### Dear Friends,

A few weeks ago, I was introduced to the Thameslink Railway advert at a meeting I was attending. The strapline of the advert is that 'every stop is a story.' This doesn't have to only apply to train travel but could be to do with many different forms of transport, including walking and cycling as well. It may be a specific event, an annual holiday somewhere or a visit to someone, either family or friend. There are so many ways in which this could be interpreted physically in relation to particular journeys.

Of course, we can also relate this strapline to our spiritual lives as well. Every time we stop to pray, we have a story to tell God. We can meet Jesus and rest in his presence and reflect on the story of the day or season of our life. This newsletter spans the Advent season, Christmas, and then moves

into 2026 when we renew our Covenant with God. These are all significant stops along the way. ## Circuit prayer requests

Our Superintendent Minister has reminded us of the considerations to be met when sharing prayer requests around the Circuit.

## She says:

'It is always good to pray and there may be specific times where a serious prayer request needs to be shared across the Circuit and not just within the local church. Where this is the case, please can the following guidelines be adhered to:

- 1. People's names and situations can only be disclosed as part of a prayer request where express permission has been gained in advance.
- 2. Only a person's first name can be shared.
- 3. Please do not share sensitive information.
- 4. A prayer request should be brief.

When a prayer request is being made, please pass this to the minister and the Circuit Administrator in the first instance who will then have a conversation prior to any wider circulation taking place.

- 1. Prayer requests will be circulated to Senior Stewards in the churches by the Circuit Administrator.
- 2. Senior Stewards are then to consider carefully the best persons or groups within the church with whom to share the prayer request. This may include a church prayer group, Minister, Local Preacher/Worship Leader for the upcoming Sunday or within church notices for personal intercession. (Where a service is being livestreamed or otherwise recorded, then special attention needs to be paid as to whether it is appropriate to include within Sunday intercessions).
- 3. Ensure that no prayer request is shared on any church websites, social media or any other outward public platform.'

#### from Lexden:

ALTHOUGH we have one of the smallest congregations in the circuit, we, like the other churches, maintain a close contact with our members who are no longer able to attend our Sunday services.

WE have recently been collecting items for the shoebox appeal and were surprised by the number we were able to fill. A big thanks go to all who gave, also for the cash donations received. Thirty people sat down and enjoyed a sumptuous buffet lunch and a great time of fellowship. We also managed to exceed the 100kg target of donations for the Colchester Foodbank.

WHAT a joy it was to have our Church Anniversary worship led by Rev Robin and members of our Junior Church. They led us with Prayers, Bible readings and song, with one young lady who is currently studying for her A levels sharing with us her Testimony. The service was followed with a picnic lunch and games; the curling was very popular.

WE said a fond farewell and thankyou to one of our long standing and loyal members, Daphne, who died in October. A service of thanksgiving and celebration of her long, adventure-filled life was held at The Ark, which was packed with her friends and family. Daphne brought such joy to so many people in her life and she will be sadly missed.

WE were delighted to be led by Joe in his Number 2 (Army) uniform for our Remembrance Sunday service.

AS we move through Advent the banners which adorn the internal walls at the Ark have been changed from their summer display and our outdoor banner wishing all a peaceful Christmas is in place near the entrance. The Advent services will include two arranged by our own members and our carol service supported by our in-house musicians and friends - The Arkestra – will take place on 14<sup>th</sup> December.

BEFORE that, two large groups of children and their teachers from Brinkley Grove Primary School will be welcomed to the Ark for Christingle services in the afternoon of 8<sup>th</sup> December.

WE look forward to joining our friends at Castle on Christmas Day and with the rest of the Circuit at Wimpole Road on 28<sup>th</sup> December.

#### from Wimpole Road:

AS detailed in the previous Circuit Newsletter, Wimpole Road has undergone some much-needed improvements, mainly at the back of the church where our new kitchenette has been installed. Other significant changes have been made to the vestibule and vestry as well as installing a fully accessible toilet.

The Remembrance Sunday service led by Rev Hannah incorporated a dedication of these facilities, which were part funded by two generous donations given in memory of former much-loved church members.

We at Wimpole Road are indebted to the Colchester Circuit for their invaluable grant, which has enabled our renovation project to come into fruition. We were able to conform to the current Church Mission Plan as well as fulfilling our own mission objectives: mainly to maintain our status as a warm and welcoming church and to encourage new members of the congregation to feel welcome, identify their needs and give them the opportunity to become more involved. Therefore by moving the

Sunday coffee into the main church building, this will greatly enhance the fellowship shared after the service.

The Circuit Service on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> December, will provide an opportunity for you all to experience the changes in person, where a warm welcome is guaranteed.

HOWEVER, if you can't wait that long, why not come to our Family Carol Service at 6.30p.m. on Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> December where Boxted Silver Band will be playing. This is a United Service with St. Stephen's Church, but everyone is welcome.

#### from The Well:

THE Building Project: In an earlier Newsletter it was reported that we had submitted a 'preliminary enquiry application' of our building plans to Colchester City Council. We received their feedback, and, though the scheme was viewed positively in most areas, there was a desire for some of the Victorian features to remain at the front of the building. Our architect has drawn up new plans which have taken on board the comments, and we are in the process of finalising it for submission to Colchester City Council for full planning permission.

ON 23<sup>rd</sup> November we had our Caring Service when Souzan from Bridgeway Mission was our speaker. We collected toiletries and baby clothes for Bridgeway, and, good quality second-hand towels for Colchester Engagement and Next Steps (Night Shelter).

IT may well be advertised elsewhere, but this is a reminder that our Christmas Fayre is on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> December in the hall from 2 - 4pm. Entry is free and there will be children's activities, various stalls and refreshments.

AS part of Churches Together in Myland, Chesterwell Co-op has given permission for us to sing Christmas Carols outside the store on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> December at 6.30pm with members of Boxted Silver Band providing the music. We will be collecting donations for East Anglia's Children's Hospices. Mersea Homes are keen to be involved and will film some of the singing for their Christmas promotion. Do come and join us if you would like to.

WE wish all our Circuit friends a peaceful Christmas and a blessed New Year.

#### from Wivenhoe:

AS an ageing and infirm congregation we find it increasingly difficult to fill the various posts required to run the Church. This is exacerbated by the demands to maintain and run an old building without an appointed Property Secretary. However, we still maintain a loving and caring place of worship and service, with Sunday worship attended by between 20 and 30 people each week, including visitors and new faces.

A MONTHLY bible study has begun, led by Rev Hannah Chun.

WE will hold our annual Christmas Gift Service on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> December.

THE Boxted Methodist Silver Band recently asked to hold a band service in memory of Joe. This took place on Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> October. With our Church not being big enough to hold the band and those wishing to attend, St Mary's kindly agreed to host it. And Rev Erwin Lammens agreed to

preach. It was indeed well attended; the band were excellent. Joe was fondly remembered and God was worshipped in word, song and spirit.

OUR involvement with, and commitment to, 'Churches Together in Wivenhoe' continues. Recently we took part in the Service of Remembrance and wreath laying – always very well attended by people in the town. The Christmas Card outlining all Wivenhoe Churches' Advent and Christmas activities has been designed, printed and will be delivered to every household shortly. Carols on the Quay is again arranged for Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> December at 6pm.

FINALLY, Wivenhoe wishes everyone in the Circuit a happy and peaceful Christmas. May we all be renewed by the celebration of God's love revealed by the birth of his Son, our Saviour.

#### from West Mersea:

OUR Community Coffee/Lunch meetings have continued throughout the Summer and Autumn and we are now back to our Warm Spaces venture on Wednesdays from 10am until 2pm. It is a joy to welcome our guests who week by week share some of their life stories with us. For some it is their only contact with others as they do not have any close family.

OUR Baby and Toddler group continues to flourish as we meet on Thursdays from 9am until 11.30am. It is good to see how well they look forward to meeting up and having a chat with each other.

Friendships are made as children meet up with those they will start school with. New mums are reassured by those with older children, with grandparents keen to give advice!

WE held our Harvest Weekend in October with a Harvest Supper on Saturday evening for our church family with support from our friends in the Circuit, followed by a musical evening involving our newly-formed singing group, which was both entertaining and great fun! On Sunday, our Harvest service was taken by Rev Hannah which was well received. We were asked to bring dry goods for the "Mersea Pantry" which is an island charity supported by Mersea residents.

WE have already started planning for next year's Beach Club alongside other Mersea churches, following a very successful one this year when we hosted 174 children and their parents and carers during the week.

DURING our Autumn Church Council there was much discussion about our hopes and plans for our onward journey of service to our community as we reflect on the Circuit Vision Statement, which is to be a diverse, outward-looking community where people grow in faith and share what it means to walk with Jesus, through word, action, and prayer. We have added our own statement whilst "Learning, Loving, Living for Christ".

WE hope that as you travel through the Advent season you will find peace and joy in the services of which you are a part.
